## **FEATURE PLANT**

This month's feature plant is the versatile flax lily (*Dianella* spp.), a clumping plant with fleshy roots, straplike leaves and delicate flowers that are usually blue or purple. It is generally free from pests and diseases, and is resistant to drought and frost. It is also a good choice for controlling erosion, due to its deep root system.

Dianella species may well be included in Paul Carmody's Tavern Talk, as the leaves were used traditionally for making cord and string and the tubers and fruits for bush tucker. But a word of warning: not every species of Dianella produces berries that are safe to eat.
